- **Ecclesiastes 3:21 (KJV):** "Who knoweth the spirit of man that goeth upward, and the spirit of the beast that goeth downward to the earth?"
  - Hebrew: "Ruach ha-adam" (רוּחַ הָאָדָם)—man's spirit ascends (to God); "ruach ha-behemah" (רוּחַ הַבְּהֵמָה)—beast's spirit earthbound. Distinct fates, implying distinct natures.
- **1 Corinthians 2:11 (KJV):** "For what man knoweth the things of a man, save the spirit of man which is in him? even so the things of God knoweth no man, but the Spirit of God."
  - Greek: "Pneuma tou anthropou" (πνεῦμα τοῦ ἀνθρώπου, G4151)—"spirit of man" = inner awareness, separate from "Pneuma tou Theou" (God's Spirit). Human self-consciousness vs. divine essence.
- **Analysis:** "Spirit in man" = God-given spark—ruach/pneuma—lifting brain to mind. Animals have "nephesh" (נֶפֶשׁ, H5315, Gen 1:20)—soul/life—but no upward spirit or understanding (Job 32:8).

### 2. Distinct from Holy Spirit: God's Nature

- **John 4:24 (KJV):** "God is a Spirit: and they that worship him must worship him in spirit and in truth."
  - Greek: "Pneuma ho Theos" (πνεῦμα ὁ θεός, G4151)—God is spirit—His essence, power, makeup. Holy Spirit = "Pneuma Hagion" (Πνεῦμα Ἅγιον)—God's active nature (Acts 2:4).
- **Romans 8:16 (KJV):** "The Spirit itself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God."
  - Greek: "Pneuma hemon" (πνεῦμα ἡμῶν)—"our spirit" = human spark; "to Pneuma" (τὸ Πνεῦμα)—Holy Spirit, distinct, interacts with ours.
- **Analysis:** Holy Spirit = God's being—imparts power (Acts 1:8), not inherent in us. "Spirit in man" = seed/spark—enables connection (Rom 8:16), not God's full essence. Animals lack both—no bridge to God.

### 3. Creative Qualities and God-Relationship

- **Genesis 1:26-27 (KJV):** "And God said, Let us make man in our image... So God created man in his own image..."
  - Hebrew: "Tzelem Elohim" (תְּזֵלֶם אֱלֹהִים, H6754)—"image" = likeness in mind, will, creativity. Animals (Gen 1:24) get no such stamp—instinct-driven (e.g., birds nest, no art).
- **Psalms 8:5 (KJV):** "For thou hast made him a little lower than the angels, and hast crowned him with glory and honour."
  - Hebrew: "Me'at me-Elohim" (מֵעַתְּמֵ־אֱלֹהִים, H430)—"little lower than God/angels" (Elohim dual use)—elevated status, creative dominion (v. 6).
- **John 1:12 (KJV):** "But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God..."
  - Greek: "Tekna Theou" (τέκνα θεοῦ, G5043)—"sons of God" = family potential, via spirit-enabled choice. Animals can't "receive" (no mind).
- **Analysis:** "Spirit in man" sparks creativity (music, tech—God's echo) and relationship (prayer, sonship)—animals lack this uplink. Flesh trains character—choice over instinct (sin vs. obedience).

### 4. Daniel 4: Nebuchadnezzar's Animal Mind

- **Daniel 4:16 (KJV):** "Let his heart be changed from man's, and let a beast's heart be given unto him; and let seven times pass over him."
  - Hebrew: "Levav enasha" (לֵבָב אִנְשָׁא, H3825)—"heart of man" swapped for "levav cheyva" (לֵבָב חַיָּוָה)—"beast's heart." Aramaic shift—mind degraded.
- **Daniel 4:33 (KJV):** "...He was driven from men, and did eat grass as oxen... till his hairs were grown like eagles' feathers..."
  - Hebrew/Aramaic: No "spirit" term, but "heart" (mind/will) stripped—behavior reverts to animal (instinct, no reason).
- **Analysis:** "Spirit in man" possibly removed—Nebuchadnezzar loses consciousness of self/God (v. 34, restored: "reason returned"). Animals = nephesh only; humans = nephesh + ruach. Evil's lesson: sans spirit, we're beasts.

## Synthesis: Spirit in Man vs. Animal Life

- **Animals:**
  - Life = "nephesh" (Gen 1:20)—breath/soul, instinct-driven. No upward spirit (Ecc 3:21), no mind beyond survival—eat, mate, die.
  - No God-link—can't create (e.g., art) or repent (no sin-awareness).
- **Humans:**
  - Life = nephesh + "ruach/pneuma" (Job 32:8, 1 Cor 2:11)—spirit sparks mind, consciousness, choice.
